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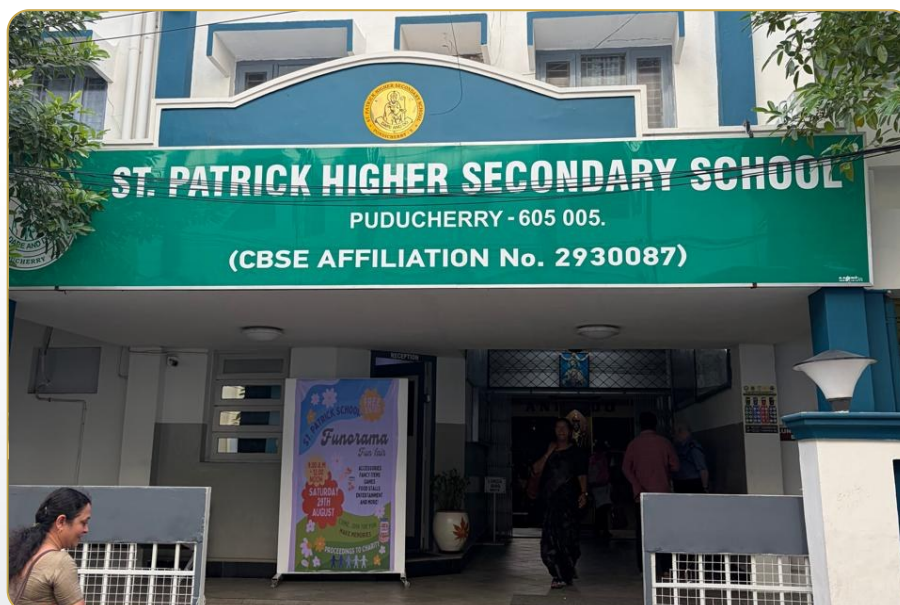
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ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

ABOUT SPMUN

St. Patrick is proud to convene SPMUN '26, the first edition of St. Patrick Model United Nations — an academic simulation of the United Nations in which students take the seats of diplomats and negotiate the questions that occupy the real Assembly. Delegates research a country's position, defend it under scrutiny, build coalitions with those who disagree with them, and draft resolutions that must survive a vote.

A Model UN conference asks a great deal of a student in a short time. It asks them to read widely and cite honestly; to speak to a room without notes and hold its attention; to represent a position that may not be their own and to represent it faithfully; and to find, in a hall of competing interests, the sentence that everyone can sign. These are not debating tricks. They are the working habits of diplomacy, and they transfer to every room a young person will later stand in.

SPMUN is built around four committees, each with an agenda chosen for its substance rather than its familiarity, and each accessible to a particular age group. Delegates are supported before the conference with Committee Study Guides, position paper templates and training sessions, so that first-time participants arrive prepared rather than apprehensive.

Above all, SPMUN is intended to be a meeting. Students from across Puducherry will spend two days in one another's company, arguing seriously and parting as friends. In that experience — the discovery that disagreement and respect can occupy the same room — lies the whole purpose of this conference.



MESSAGE FROM THE CORRESPONDENT

Model United Nations is more than an academic exercise. It is a platform that asks young people to think carefully, to speak responsibly, and to lead by persuasion rather than by assertion. In simulating the proceedings of the United Nations, our students step into the roles of the world's negotiators, deliberate on questions that have no easy answers, and learn to build agreement across genuine differences.

At St. Patrick, we have always held that an education must reach past the textbook. Our aim is to send out young men and women who are articulate, empathetic and oriented towards solutions. A Model UN conference provides exactly that arena — one in which research, debate and negotiation develop confidence, collaboration and leadership together.

ABOUT THE COMMITTEES



UNITED NATIONS GENERAL ASSEMBLY — DISARMAMENT AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY COMMITTEE (UNGA-DISEC)

DISEC is the First Committee of the General Assembly. It considers disarmament, global challenges to peace and the threats to international security that fall short of open war. All 193 Member States are represented and each holds a single vote; its resolutions are recommendatory, which makes the quality of the argument the only real currency in the room.

UNITED NATIONS HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL (UNHRC)

The Human Rights Council is the UN body responsible for promoting and protecting human rights worldwide. It addresses violations wherever they occur, makes recommendations to Member States, and provides a standing forum for dialogue on thematic and country situations. Its 47 members are elected by the General Assembly, and its debates are among the most closely watched in the system.

WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION (WHO)

The World Health Organization is the UN's specialised agency for international public health. Through the World Health Assembly it sets global norms, coordinates responses to health emergencies, and supports Member States in building health systems. Debate in this committee turns less on sovereignty than on evidence, financing and what a health ministry can realistically deliver.

ALL INDIA POLITICAL PARTIES MEET (AIPPM)

AIPPM is a domestic simulation in which participants represent India's political parties rather than sovereign states. Portfolios are assigned to named leaders, the Chair sits as Moderator, and the debate follows the rhythm of Indian parliamentary argument. It rewards delegates who know the party line, the constituency behind it, and the point at which consensus becomes possible.

Agenda: Ensuring the right to education for children in conflict-affected regions.

Agenda: Building an Indian Framework for Responsible AI and Deepfake Governance while Safeguarding Freedom of Speech and Democratic Processes.

UNITED NATIONS GENERAL ASSEMBLY — DISARMAMENT AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY COMMITTEE (UNGA-DISEC)

Agenda: Curbing the illicit trafficking of small arms and light weapons.

Adherence to the rules of procedure, decorum and the Chair's rulings.

Contribution in Committee

Substantive participation in debate, caucusing and documentation.

Accuracy of Content

Fidelity to the assigned country or portfolio's real position.

Research and Presentation

Depth of preparation, quality of sources and the position paper submitted.

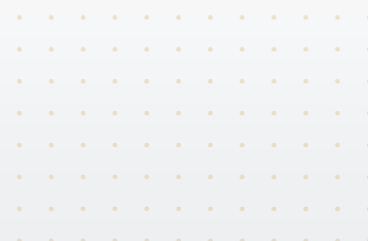

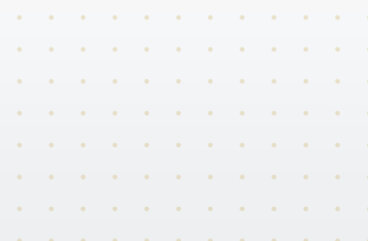
